

Festival Rules

1. Smoking is not tolerated at any time.
2. You may not leave the school grounds without a parent, director or host.
3. You must be at all rehearsals and performances and on time!
4. No use of drugs or alcohol will be tolerated.
5. You must adhere to the 11:00 p.m. curfew.
6. No participant may drive themselves or ride with other students.

- Violation of these rules can result in a student's immediate removal from the festival.

Local Rules and Reminders...

- e Please wear your name tag at all times.
- e Do not wander around the school during breaks – especially between 8:45 and 3:20.
- e Your ensemble manager is your best first option for asking questions.
- e Be courteous and gracious guests at BUHS and in your host's home.
- e You may go outside during breaks but must stay either on the front lawn or the football field – do not go into parking lots or streets. You may also hang out in the auditorium lobby (BUHS senior lounge).
- e Make sure you have your music and a pencil at each rehearsal.
- e Snacks, t-shirts and tickets will be for sale in the auditorium lobby all day Thursday and Friday.
